## Diabetes Intelligence

### Overview

Health Intelligence has developed a clinical dashboard for Diabetes, initially based on the National Service Framework (NSF). It is currently being updated to incorporate NICE guidelines and quality standards.

The dashboard reports on all aspects of Diabetes from a Primary Care perspective. It aims to aid GP Practices to deliver the best possible care to patients in line with current standards and helps to reduce the cost of diabetic complications.

### Features of the Reports

There are a number of reports available for you to use:

- Patients Diagnostic Status – This shows the understanding of your current population; patients whose data suggests that they should be coded as having Diabetes, therefore an area of investigation; and highlights patients who are at risk of developing Diabetes.
- Management of Patients – Assists you to ensure patients are treated in line with NSF, Quality standards and highlights any gaps in care.
- Outcomes for Patients – Profiles the secondary complications associated with Diabetes.

### Benefits of the Reports

Use of the clinical dashboard will help you to:

1. Tackle health inequalities. Figures from the National Diabetic Audit (2011) found that only 54% of diagnosed patients were receiving all 9 essential health checks from Diabetes UK '15 Healthcare Essentials'.
2. Identify your patients who are at risk of becoming diabetic and therefore careful monitoring and early detection will improve patient outcomes.
3. Reduce hospital admissions by early treatment interventions and monitoring.
4. Understand your diabetic population so that the correct commissioning of relevant services can take place.

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
